

Frederick Banks Du Rietz started his career having won the Hugo Weaving award for his stage performance of *The Tribulations of Abacus Christy*. While studying at the Academy of Film, Theatre, and Television in Sydney, Frederick appeared on ABC's *Friday on My Mind*.

Shortly after, Frederick starred alongside Anna Torv, Danielle Cormack, and Jackie Weaver in the Netflix thriller *Secret City*, for which he was nominated for Best New Talent by the Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts (AACTA).

Later in the year, Du Rietz starred in the coming-of-age film *Bilched*, alongside Hal Cumpston, Jeremy Simms, and Rhys Muldoon, which won three awards at the Chelsea Film Festival in NYC. One of which went to Frederick for Best Supporting Actor.

Fred later appeared on television sets across Australia when he was introduced as Jeremy in the Channel 9 hospital drama *Amazing Grace*, starring Kate Jenkinson, Sigrid Thornton, and Alex Dimitriades.

Frederick later appeared in 5 episodes of *Black Snow S2*. He plays the enigmatic, privileged and overly-attached character of Sean Cosgrove alongside Kat Stewart, who plays the highly nurturing and relentless matron in the family.

Recently, Du Rietz played the role of cold and calculated killer, Kyle Hadden in two episodes of *NCIS: Sydney*. Seeking revenge, Kyle becomes the mastermind behind a major bomb plot against Trigger and the AFP.
