- I also did a monologue from *The Glass Menagerie* by Tennessee Williams, playing Tom Wingfield.

- I studied drama at St Patrick's College from Year 11, (NCEA Level 1) until halfway through year 12 (NCEA Level 2).

- I was also in the St Patrick's College choir, *Con Anima*, from 2019 2020, Years 11–12.
