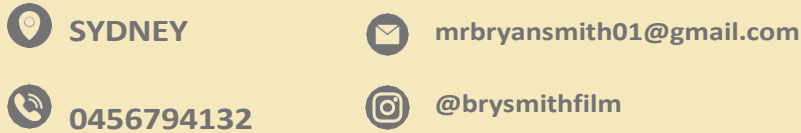


BRYAN SMITH
