#### JOB OFFERS ARE FAST PILING UP FOR

Winners & Losers star Damien Bodie. So much so, he's finding it hard to keep up with the rising demand!

Over the past two seasons, the former Neighbours actor has delighted viewers as Frances's (Virginia Gay) happy-go-lucky assistant, Jonathan. Now, everyone wants a piece of him.

"The best thing is people come up to me and go, I want an assistant just like you. Where do I hire someone like you?" the 27-year-old laughs.

"But, the thing is, I want an assistant like me, too, because he is so caring and loves Frances dearly. He's always carefree and enjoying himself."

Sounds like Damien himself.

Meeting the actor is like being greeted
by a big puppy dog with boundless
energy. In fact, you leave the interview
telling yourself to love life a little more.
With his infectious energy, it's little
wonder casting agents have been
so quick to snap him up.

"I auditioned for Jonathan when I was overseas," Damien says, recalling how he'd worked with series producer Maryanne Carroll on a show called Short Cuts years earlier.

"She remembered me from back then and had trust in me. She was in my corner, even though I was far away. I did about three auditions on tape and booked the job while I was in the States. It brought me back to Australia – it's my dream role."


Being on set every day is a joy for Damien, who says the number one question he's asked by fans is if he's gay – like his character.

"People are always asking," he says with a smile. "But, I take that as a compliment, because it means they believe the character. If you play a villain and people hate you, then you're doing your job. I'm not gay, but I think they are the funniest people

I've ever met and that's why I love the energy of playing Jonathan."

This week in Winner & Losers,
Jonathan finds himself in a spot of
bother with his new squeeze, Rhys
(Nick Simpson-Deeks), Yes, Jenny's
(Melissa Bergland) Rhys! The former
boyfriend who broke her heart by
revealing he was gay, Uncomfortable
with open displays of affection, Rhys's
awkwardness comes to a head when
the pair is out in public.

For Damien, playing a homosexual character can prove a tad challenging.



"I have to pull back because I'm over-the-top in life anyway," he admits. "In fact, for Jonathan, I have to pull my energy back a lot more, because on screen I like to go, 'More, more, more', but there is a fine line.

"But, I have to say, I don't feel like
I've done my job until I've been told
'No' by a director about 10 times
during a scene, because that means
I'm bringing ideas to the table.
Sometimes they aren't right, but
I just like to offer things up."

Following his stint as Dylan Timmins in Neighbours and guest roles in Aussie

dramas including City Homicide, Damien took off to America to stretch his acting wings, with great results.

"I went there to do improv training," he says. "All comedic actors have done it, like the people I admire, including Jim Carrey. I did some stand-up at Hollywood Improv, which is the same place where Jerry Seinfeld, Mike Myers and Jim Carrey performed. It was the scariest thing of my life! I don't think of myself as particularly funny and when it's your own material for seven minutes to make complete strangers laugh, it's like standing there naked and just saying, 'Judge me."

Damien also took some acting classes alongside Hollywood actress Heather Graham, 42, best known for her roles in Boogie Nights, Austin Powers: The Spy Who Shagged Me and The Hangover.

"It was amazing, because you're working with elite artists," he says.

"It was so rewarding."

Now settled in Melbourne, Damien lives with Ben Nicholas (left, centre) and Kyal Marsh, the boys behind Neighbours' Stingray and Boyd.

"After Neighbours, we all went our separate ways and travelled for a few years," he says. "Then we all ended up in Melbourne at the same time. It's great. Chaos is one word to describe it, though!"

As for Neighbours, Damien says he's grateful to be part of the iconic show.

"When you're there, you feel like part of a community - it's just got such a family vibe," he says.

"Stefan Dennis and Ian Smith were still there for the 20th anniversary and those are guys I admired growing up. They are a huge part of the show. I loved every second. It opened so many doors for me."







Chatting to TV WEEK, Damien, who plays Dylan. Stingray's bad-boy sibling, now explains that after two years on Ramsay Street, it was time to go.

"Leaving was a joint decision (with the show's producers)," Damien (far left, with Ben) reveals. "I wanted to leave on a high – while my character was still having some fun with interesting storylines and while I was working with people who hadn't got sick of mel! think they realised it was time for Dylan to move on as well.

"I'd done a long list of children's TV series before Neighbours. This role has taught me so much and has set me up for the future."

Damien, 21, believes it's fitting that he and Ben, who plays Dylan's younger brother, complete their final scenes around the same time.

"I could not picture Dylan on the show without Stingray," he says. "We've become like brothers in real life, too."

As for what's next for the young actor, Damien is hoping to take a well-deserved break before reassessing his options.

"I'm just really happy kicking back and having a look around, as well as spending some time with friends and family," he says.


