HANNA MANGAN LAWRENCE

Hanna Mangan Lawrence is one of Australia's most talented young actresses, with an array of credits from both domestically & internationally acclaimed television and cinema to her name.

Hanna began her career in 2005 with short films *Simulation 1201* & *Galore*. Hanna's break through performance was in the short film *Sexy Thing*, which was accepted into the Cannes Film Festival. She was then cast as the lead role Chasely in the feature film *Acolytes* directed by Jon Hewitt. The film premiered at the 2008 Toronto Film Festival.

She is best known for her role in ABC Television's *Bed Of Roses* for which she received a 2008 AFI Nomination for 'Best supporting actress'. In 2010, Hanna completed shooting Series 3 of *Bed Of Roses*.

In 2011, Hanna shot a series regular role in the US hit television series *Spartacus: Vengeance (Season 2)* for the Starz Network. Hanna played opposite Joel Edgerton in director Nash Edgerton's feature film *The Square*, and in 2012 was seen in director Kriv Stenders' feature film *Lucky Country* in the role of Sarah alongside actor Aden Young. In 2010, she filmed lead roles in independent feature film, *Thirst* as well as Jon Hewitt's film *X*, both released in early 2012.

In 2014 Hanna starred in ABC 1 series *Old School*, opposite Sam Neill, and Bryan Brown, as well as a support-lead role in the feature film, *The Reckoning* alongside Jonathon Lapaglia and Luke Hemsworth.

Hannah then moved onto filming roles in ABC/Amazon studios drama *Point of Honor*, directed by Randall Wallace, as Estella Rose; and the feature film, *Beyond The Reach* opposite Michael Douglas and Jeremy Irvine.

Hanna has recently completed shooting Kriv Stenders' follow up to the hit movie *Red Dog*, entitled *Red Dog: True Blue* opposite Levi Miller and Jason Issacs. Hanna can recently be seen in a leading role in the Warner Horizon/CW drama series, *Containment* as Teresa, directed by David Nutter and will next be seen in the US feature film *Sweetheart* for Blumhouse Productions and ABC Miniseries *RIOT*.

Hanna's body of work has been recognised by various critics including her 2008 AACTA nomination for award for Best Supporting Actress (*Bed of Roses*), in 2009 she received a Filmink Award For Best Australian Newcomer (*The Square*), received a TV Week Logie Nomination - Graham Kennedy Award Most Outstanding Talent (*Bed of Roses*) and in 2013, was nominated for a Film Critics Circle Award for Best Performance by a Young Actress (*Thirst*).
