Clare was set the task of allowing Nicole Kidman to deepen her rather young-sounding natural voice in order to portray a woman four or five years older than the real age of the actress.


Clare was also asked to encourage Ms. Kidman to allow herself to be more easily understood by all English speaking audiences, while not loosing her Australian origins.

I worked with Claire Crowther on "The Navigator", an AFI multi-award winning feature film which I co-wrote and directed.

Claire devised the medieval Cumbrian dialect in the film. She worked with two of my lead actors prior to the New Zealand shoot, and was responsible for Dialect Direction in the post-synching of the film - a mammoth feat in two weeks. This involved the whole cast, including actors dubbing for the original players of minor roles, who remained in New Zealand.

Claire was Dialogue Coach to the children used in the post-synch stage, recreating the reality of location with them.

Claire invented a dialect approximating a medieval Cumbrian dialect, from contemporary tapes supplied by Julie Wilson-Dixon of Central School, and Claire's own knowledge of language and dialect.

I saw the fruits of her work as Dialogue Coach on the internationally successful feature film "Dead Calm", directed by Phil Noyce, produced by Kennedy Miller and starring Nicole Kidman and Sam Neill. Phil is a friend of mine (and also my landlord!) and I know he valued her contribution.

Directors need Dialogue Coaches to help the actors use their voices to best advantage and to collaborate on scenes with the director.

Australia needs such expertise as Claire Crowther offers, to help maintain and expand the success of our film industry.
