MYLES POLLARD

Myles is a leading Australian actor who has worked extensively in film, TV and theatre since graduating from NIDA.

Myles is best known as Nick Ryan in the Nine Network's long running series McLeod's Daughters, earning him a nomination for the TV Week Silver Logie for Most Popular Actor. Myles's other leading TV roles include Phill De La Salle in Underbelly A Tale Of Two Cities, Mack in Rescue Special Ops, Stuart White in Sea Patrol Series 5, Henry Dupont in Double Trouble, Robert in Water Rats and TV series from East West 101 for SBS, Packed To The Rafters and Home and Away for the Seven Network, to Wildside, The War That Changed Us, Mystery Road, Itch and Matchbox Picture's The Heights all for the ABC.

Myles's feature film credits include the starring roles of Phelan in X-Men Origins: Wolverine directed by Gavin Hood for 20th Century Fox, Boyce in the Australian feature Thirst, directed by Robert Carter, Dan in The Turning opposite Rose Byrne, Detective Monaghan in Foreshadow, Andy in Drift opposite Sam Worthington which Myles also co-produced, Bruce in Looking For Grace, Pete Whishart in Jasper Jones, directed by Rachel Perkins, Matt Chandler in The Gateway, Riley in Kriv Stenders' feature film Danger Close and Sgt. Beaufort in Before Dawn. Most recently Myles starred in the Australian film How To Please A Woman as Richard and as Frank in Adam Morris' Frank And Frank.

On stage Myles starred in Boy Gets Girl, A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Glass Menagerie and Extinction all for Black Swan Theatre Company, and the Black Swan/Sydney Theatre Company's co-production of City of Gold directed by Shari Sebbens. Myles many other theatre credits include The True Story Of Butterfish for Brisbane Powerhouse, Mistero Buffo for B Sharp/Belvoir St Theatre, Love Letters for NIDA Company, End of the Rainbow for the Ensemble Theatre, Romeo and Juliet and The Winter's Tale for the Bell Shakespeare Company as well as a WA production of Sydney II: Lost and Found, directed by Stuart Halusz.

Myles will next be seen on screen, in the role of Neal Collins in the television series The Twelve Season 2.
