Amelia Kelly is a Perth, Australia-based actor who made her television debut in the ABC/Matchbox series, **The Heights** playing the series regular role of "Frankie", alongside a stellar cast incl; Roz Hammond, Dan Paris and Saskia Hapele.

Amelia played the role of "Cami" in the award-winning US web series, **What We See** (2020); the lead role, "Katie" in the award winning US web series pilot **Trunk Travelers;** and plays the role of "Hayley" in the Australian short feature **Hitting The Road**.

At the young age of 6, she was cast in her first short film, **Beyond My Imagination**. In **Busting Out The Bells**, she plays opposite James Bingham (Swagger - AppleTV+) as his younger sister, "Kate". Amelia plays the lead, "Alex", in the short film, **Treasure Maps**, and **Tinned Spaghetti**.

Amelia signed with US representation Buchwald Talent Agency at age 9. Since age 4, Amelia has trained weekly at the Ali Roberts Studio both for Screen Acting and Voice & Accent.

The Heights is a series driven by inclusivity both on and off screen and tackles a wide range of social issues faced by everyday Australians of all ages, from all walks of life, reflecting the melting pot of modern urban Australia.

Shot in Western Australia, *The Heights* provided a huge boost to the local television industry, employing nearly 100 local crew and casting 93 speaking and extras roles, including several first-time actors, writers and directors.

The Heights is produced by Matchbox Pictures and For Pete's Sake Productions for ABC and developed and produced with the assistance of ABC in association with Screenwest, Lotterywest and NBCUniversal. International sales will be handled by NBCUniversal Distribution.



Q+A | Amelia's Acting Journey



One of the many success stories to come out of the Ali Roberts Studio is that of student Amelia Kelly. Amelia started classes when she was just 6 years old, under Ali's guidance, she developed the skills and confidence she needed to pursue acting as a career. Today, Amelia is a successful actor best known for her performances in the TV series The Heights (ABC). Amelia credits much of her success to the training she received at the Ali Roberts Studio. "Ali was not only my drama teacher, but she was also my mentor," she said. "She helped me to build the foundations of my craft and gave me the confidence to pursue my dreams."

How long have you been acting?

Ten years. I started training when I was four and booked my first commercial when I was 6.

How often do you attend classes?

Every week I have acting and accent classes which are lots of fun with my acting friends!

What projects have you worked on?

I played Frankie in The Heights (ABC) filmed in Perth and worked on short films, web series, voiceovers and commercials.

What is it like working on-set experience?

I love being on set! You work so closely with a wide variety of crew and cast working hard to make something really beautiful, to the point you often become a second family.

How do you cope when you don't book a role?

I'm not going to lie but it's tough. I've had call backs in LA for Secrets of Sulpher Springs (Disney) and Paper Girls (Amazon). You have to accept that you weren't right for that role, move on and prepare for the next opportunity.

What is something you have learned/gained through acting?

Resilience. As an actor, you get your fair share of rejection. It helps you not just in the industry but in everyday life to build a thicker skin. To push through and take the rejection and turn it into something that makes you stronger is extremely valuable in my point of view.

What advice you could give to an aspiring actor?

Give acting classes a go. You'll develop your confidence and make new friends.


