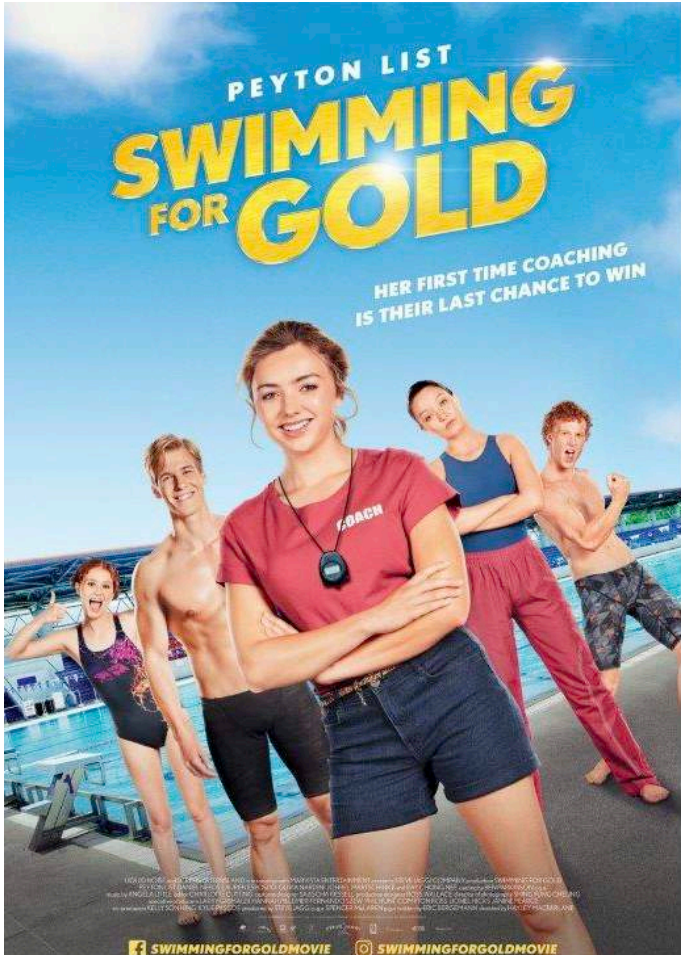
Love In Bloom is produced by Steve Jaggi and Spencer McLaren with Kylie Pascoe and Kelly Son Hing co-producing.

Young adult feature film **SWIMMING FOR GOLD** in cinemas September 17

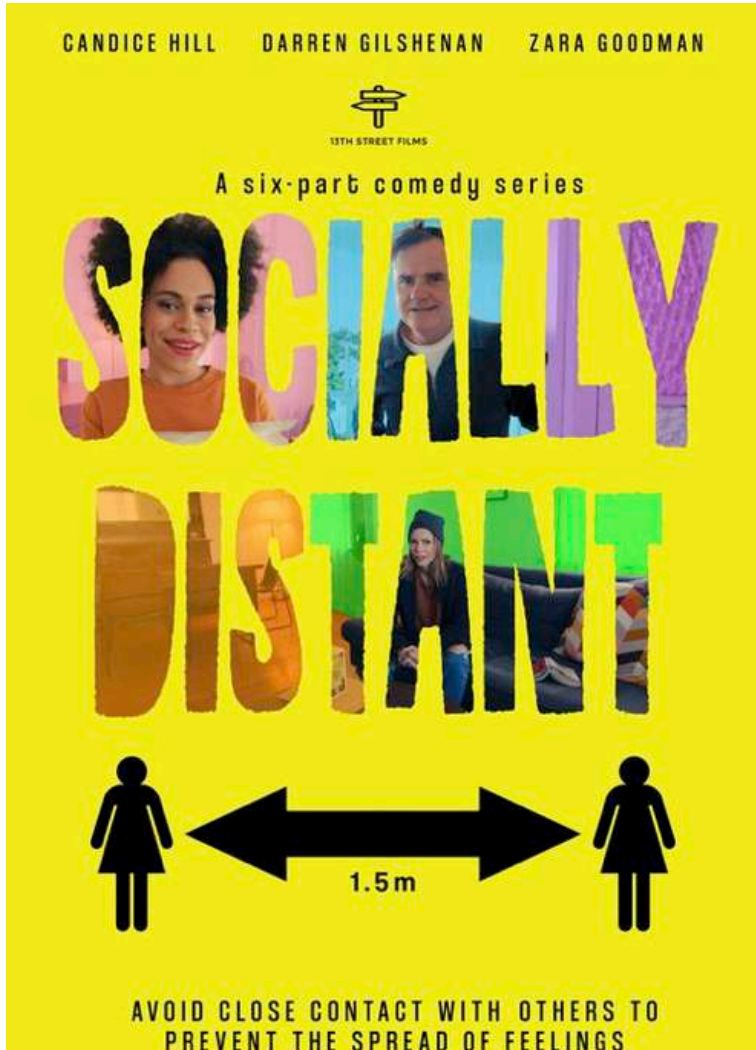

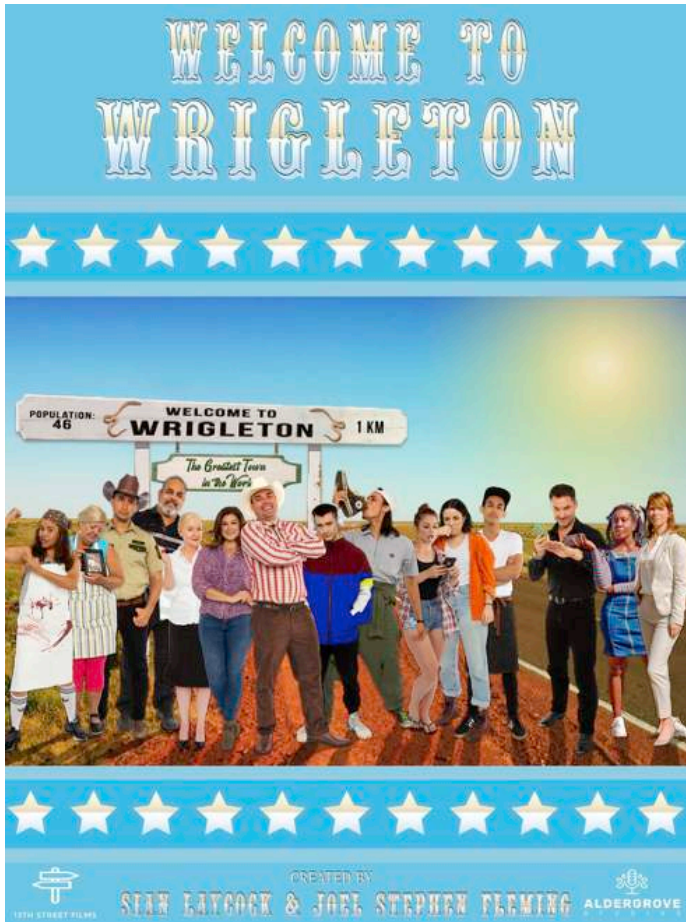
