

Jeffrey Liu is a recording artist, songwriter and actor. As a musician, Jeffrey dreams of penning radio hits as a songwriter and advocating for the queer Chinese-Australian experience through his artist project **JËVA**. In 2015 Jeffrey undertook two years of training at WAAPA, studying contemporary music to develop his artistry.

Since releasing his debut pop EP **'Typhoon'** in late 2021, **JËVA** has accrued over 70k streams on Spotify as an Independent artist, sold out his headline show at The Vanguard Sydney and has played to a crowd of thousands at Mardi Gras Fair Day '22.

Known for his charismatic stage presence, Jeffrey was scouted by Ra Chapman to play the role of Kim Han (a K-Pop Star) in her **Patrick White Playwright Award** winning play **K-Box**. Jeffrey made his acting debut in the critically acclaimed **Malthouse Theatre** production of **K-Box** in 2022.

In 2023, Jeffrey made his musical theatre debut with the star-studded cast of **'The Lucky Country'** with **Hayes Theatre Co** and shortly after joined the cast of **Belvoir St's** production of **Miss Peony** for the national tour.

In his spare time Jeffrey enjoys making Tik Toks, multi-day hikes and championing Australian pop music on his weekly radio show **'Tall Pop'** at **FBI Radio Sydney**.
